Saint Romedius

According to medieval biographies of saints, on his return from a pilgrimage to Rome around the end of the 4th century AD, the nobleman Romedius, originally from Thaur in the Inn valley, decided to withdraw to a cave and live as a hermit in the Val di Non area, in an inaccessible valley a short distance from Sanzeno, together with his companions Abraham and David. In actual fact, as historic and archive investigations have shown, the existence of the hermit, a member of an aristocratic Bavarian family, can be dated to the first decades of the 11th century. The first certain news of the cult which extended from the Prince Bishopric of Trento right up to Austria and
